Where Can I Get Help with Making my Will?

You can approach a solicitor who specialises in drafting wills - your local law society can help you with this – or you can approach the Public Trustees or one of the major Trust companies.

Bequest Wording

If you already have a Will, then a new one isn't always necessary to make minor changes. Often, a Codicil is the easiest way to make a short legal amendment to your existing Will, though legal advice should be obtained in the event of any doubt.

The following example of wording can be used or adapted to your requirements in writing a new Will or adding a Codicil to your existing Will:

I bequeath to the Australian Spinal Research Foundation of Suite 9, 3990 Pacific Highway, Loganholme in the State of Queensland
